## CREATIVE ARTS, HIGHER REPRESENTATION & TOURS SCHOLARSHIPS

### Information for Candidates

Waverley College awards Creative Arts and Co-curricular Scholarships as means of encouraging students to realise their potential and strive for excellence by:

- Encouraging those with outstanding talent and application to achieve at the highest levels as role models for all students, current and future
- Providing access to opportunities which might otherwise be unavailable
- Providing broader opportunities for co-curricular participation at the College.

The College offers the following scholarship programs in this area:

- *Creative Arts Scholarship*: Covers full or partial remission of costs up to a maximum of \$1000 for individual music, drama, visual art or public speaking tuition incurred by a student during his time at the College.
- *Higher Representation Scholarship*: Covers full or partial remission of costs up to a maximum of \$1000 for tuition, travel, equipment, participation (or any other expense deemed reasonable by the Headmaster) for a student who is achieving at the highest level in his area of interest.
- *Tours Scholarship*: Provides financial support up to a maximum of \$1000 for students to attend College tours and events which might otherwise be unavailable to the student for financial reasons.

Scholarship awards of an ongoing nature are reviewed annually and are conditional upon sustained achievement in the area of choice, satisfactory participation in related College activities, application to general studies and commitment to the College.

### Who can apply?

The Creative Arts & Co-curricular Scholarships are available to students currently enrolled at Waverley College and to external applicants who have applied for enrolment.

### Applications

Candidates must complete and submit the Arts & Co-curricular Scholarship Application Form. If required, the student and/or his parent/carer may be requested to attend an interview and/or audition with the Scholarship Selection Committee.

### Application deadlines

Submissions for annual tuition costs should be forwarded to the College by the end of Term 3 in any year for the following year's tuition. A minimum of eight weeks should be allowed for processing of applications lodged at other times during the year.

### **Award**

The award of these scholarships is based upon:

- current level of performance
- demonstrated achievement in the selected area
- a demonstrated commitment to all learning
- an ability to contribute to the life of the College
- where applicable, demonstrated financial need.

The above may be measured by results in examinations and competitions, references from teachers/mentors and teacher comments on school reports. In addition, an audition or provision of portfolio may be requested. Where relevant, the parents/carers may be requested to provide a confidential Financial Statement to the College.

Candidates will be notified in writing of the result of their application. The award of Creative Arts and Co-curricular Scholarships is at the absolute discretion of the Headmaster. The College's determination in the award of the scholarship is final and no correspondence will be entered into.
