THE BR JP LACEY SCHOLARSHIP

Information for Candidates

The Brother JP Lacey Scholarship is offered annually to at least one Year 7 student of a Catholic family. It is also available for entry to Year 11. Offer of the scholarship to students in other years may be considered at the discretion of the Headmaster.

The Scholarship is awarded by the Old Boys' Union in memory of Brother Lacey who was a memorable figure at Waverley for many years and Headmaster from 1948-1953.

It is awarded to a student whose family would not be able to afford to send their son to Waverley College without the financial assistance of the Scholarship. The Scholarship covers all tuition fees.

The candidate is selected on the basis of academic performance and ability to contribute to the life of the College in areas such as liturgy, social justice, sport, creative arts or leadership.

Who can apply?

Application is open to all current students of Waverley College and those attending other government and non-government schools provided they are Catholic (a baptismal certificate will be required). The scholarship is primarily offered to students entering Year 7 and Year 11. Applicants may be considered for entry in other years at the discretion of the Headmaster. Students who are classified by the Australian Government as 'Full Fee Paying Overseas Students' (FFPOS) are not eligible to apply.

Conditions of the Scholarship

The Br JP Lacey Scholarship provides for all enrolment and tuition fees for the student. Continuation of the Scholarship is subject to the satisfactory progress of the student, which is reviewed annually. The parents/carers of the applicant are required to provide a guarantee that the applicant will remain at Waverley College for the duration of the Scholarship.

This scholarship covers tuition only. Expenses not covered by the JP Lacey Scholarship include the enrolment confirmation fee, individual subject levies, co-curricular activities, school uniforms, sporting needs and the cost of camps and excursions.

Means testing

This Scholarship is means tested. The applicant's family/carer will be required to provide a detailed statement of their financial position. This includes:

- A statement of assets and liabilities
- Copies of tax returns for both parents/carers (as applicable).

All information is treated as strictly confidential.

Scholarships will not be offered unless the means test assessment is satisfactory.

Conditions of the Scholarship

- The Scholarship provides full or partial remission of enrolment and tuition fees only. Expenses not covered by the Scholarship include individual subject levies, co-curricular activities, sporting needs and the cost of camps and excursions.
- Continuation of the scholarship is subject to the satisfactory progress of the student, which is reviewed annually by the Director of Curriculum.

How to apply

1. Complete the JP Lacey Scholarship Application, which can be obtained by contacting the Registrar or downloading from the Waverley College website.
2. If the student is not currently enrolled at the College, an Enrolment Application should also be completed and submitted with all required documentation.
3. Forward the application to the College, marked 'Private & Confidential for the Attention of the Headmaster'.
4. For external applicants, the application deadline is 1 March in the year prior to commencement.
5. If the candidate is considered eligible for the Br JP Lacey Scholarship, an interview will be arranged and the family will be requested to provide a completed Financial Statement.

External applicants:

Application deadline	First day of March in the year prior to commencement
Interviews	April in the year prior to commencement
Scholarship Offers	First week of June in the year prior to commencement

Current Students:

Application deadline	End of Term 3 in the year prior to commencement
Scholarship Offers	Term 4 in the year prior to commencement

Award and acceptance

Candidates whose applications are considered suitable will be invited to attend the College for an interview as part of the selection process.

Successful candidates will be notified in writing of an offer and will be given seven (7) working days to indicate their acceptance or otherwise. Unsuccessful candidates will be notified as soon as possible after the award is finalised.

THE COLLEGE'S DETERMINATION IN THE AWARD OF THE SCHOLARSHIP IS FINAL AND NO CORRESPONDENCE WILL BE ENTERED INTO.
