Waverley College invites applications for a Learning Support Teacher to commence in 2022. The successful applicant will join a team of eight teachers and teacher assistants to support students across Years 5 to Year 12. Delegation of duties ensures a manageable workload for all members of the team.

The successful applicant will have a primary responsibility for an identified Stage and will also, as part of the collaborative team, assist with other year groups as needed. Support to students, in the mainstream setting, is a shared responsibility with subject teachers.

Overwhelmingly, the majority of students in the learning support program are identified with learning difficulties and participate in regular classes with supplementary support.

To be successful you will need the following attributes:

- Degree qualified and current NESA Teacher Accreditation.
- A commitment to working towards the goal of achieving equal access to education for students with disabilities
- Learning Support is offered from Stage 3 to Stage 6 so experience within these parameters is highly regarded.
- Sensitivity towards students and discretion in handling confidential information
- A flexible team worker, able to readily adapt to the changing needs of the students and the busy and unpredictable nature of the school environment
- Good numeracy, verbal and written communication skills
- Familiarity with digital learning platforms and adaptive technology.

Applicants must be experienced, innovative practitioners, be supportive of the Catholic ethos of the community and be willing to participate in the co-curricular life of the College. Waverley College is a Catholic school in the Edmund Rice tradition.
