UAC Applications for 2022 are open

If you're a student in NSW or ACT and are thinking of studying at university in 2022, the Universities Admissions Centre (UAC) has announced that applications for undergraduate students has opened. You can apply for undergraduate courses, the Educational Access Scheme, Schools Recommendation Scheme, and Equity Scholarships.

UAC has emailed all students a UAC PIN, which is used along with your NESA number to login and access UAC's services. All semester 1, 2022 courses will be available from **August**.

Early bird applications will close at midnight on **Thursday 30 September**

Educational Access Scheme

Educational Access Schemes (EAS) aim to help students who have experienced significant educational disadvantage receive an offer to university.

COVID-19 Disaster Payments have been added to the financial hardship category.

Applicants can now claim financial hardship if a parent or guardian has received COVID-19 Disaster Payment for at least three months.

This is in addition to the existing provisions for applicants whose parents or guardian received JobKeeper payments.

Please note that the University of Sydney is not accepting EAS applications under this category.

Steps to completing your SRS application

Before you can apply for SRS, you need to apply for undergraduate admission through UAC. When you do, you'll be issued with a UAC application number, which you'll need to commence your SRS application.

There are no fees to apply for SRS, but there is processing fee when you apply for undergraduate admission through UAC.

1. Log in to the SRS application using your UAC application number and PIN. A series of questions and prompts will then guide you through the application process.
2. Enter your Year 11 studies, if prompted to do so in your application.
Applicants in the NSW and ACT school systems: You usually don't have to provide results of your Year 11 studies with your SRS application as UAC obtains them directly from the relevant educational authorities. If you are not prompted to enter your Year 11 studies or to provide documents there is no need to do so.
All other applicants: Enter the details of your Year 11 studies and upload a PDF of your Year 11 school report. If you don't have the PDF ready to upload when you first apply, upload it later by logging back in to SRS Check & Change (which you also access from the UAC website). You must upload your school report in order to have your studies assessed and considered by institutions as part of your SRS application. Uploaded documents cannot be edited or deleted but can be replaced up to three times.
3. Upload institution-specific documents, if required.
4. Review your application summary.

5. Accept the **declaration**.
6. Download your Confirmation of Application.

You can only submit one SRS application.

Nominating your course preferences

You don't need to nominate any courses in your SRS application because it is automatically linked to your list of course preferences in your UAC application for undergraduate admission.

UTS Elite Athlete or Performers Scheme

Are you an elite athlete or performer who represented your school or state at a national level competition/event?

Has your study been impacted because of this? If you answered yes to both of these questions, you may be eligible for a five-point adjustment to your **Selection Rank**.

ACU Guarantee – Applications Open Now

Applications to ACU's Early Entry Program, ACU Guarantee, are now open for 2022 admission.

How does it work?

By using your Year 11 results, ACU can predict a selection rank and make an offer accordingly. As part of your application, you may also choose to provide personal statements that give ACU insight into your circumstances and motivation for university study to improve your entry score for ACU Guarantee. As part of ACU's commitment to removing barriers to university participation, the following factors will be considered alongside your academic results to calculate your predicted selection rank:

- Do you live in a rural or regional area?
- Are you attending a school that has a strong relationship with ACU?
- Do you identify as Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander?
- Are you the first person in your family to attend university?

Students in Year 12 from around Australia are encouraged to apply. Offers will be made on a rolling basis from early July.

Macquarie University | COVID-19 Impact Points

Macquarie recognise the significant impact this pandemic has had on students and the stress related to university entry for 2022.

Prospective students will not have to apply for these additional adjustment factors as they will be automatically applied via their Universities Admission Centre (UAC) application.

You may apply for and receive adjustment points from more than one admissions scheme (check each scheme for eligibility criteria) but some faculties at UTS apply a cap to the total number of adjustment points that you can receive for their courses:

Business – 10-point cap

Design, Architecture and Building; Engineering and IT – 13-point cap

University of Sydney Mathematics Prerequisites

The University has [mathematics course prerequisites](#) for some courses. This means that to study certain degrees, students will need to achieve a Band 4 in the NSW Higher School Certificate (HSC) Mathematics (not general mathematics) or [equivalent](#).

- If students don't meet the mathematics requirements, they may be able to:
- complete the [Mathematics MOOC](#) (Massive Open Online Course) and exam
- apply for another course and then transfer into their preferred course in their second year (after successful completion of an accepted 1000 level mathematics unit).

Please also see Assumed Knowledge for more information. Studying at least HSC Mathematics Extension 1 will leave your options open when you choose your university degree. Knowledge of mathematics is a useful skill in any profession, even if it is not required for a particular course. No doubt, you will have to use mathematical tools such as graphs and statistics for the rest of your life. Learning mathematics also teaches you to approach problems in a systematic and logical way. NECA Electrical Practice Tests

NECA have put together resources to help Students prepare for Aptitude tests in the electrical Industry.

To be an electrician requires you have to be able to make calculations relating to electrical design. It is important to have a good understanding of sums, algebra, geometry and trigonometry. Working with Electrical can be hazardous when miscalculations occur.

Geometry comes into play when calculating cross sectional areas of cables and algebra is used when calculating current (Amps) and electrical loads.

Trigonometry comes into play when you start to look at capacitance and magnetism.

How to become a Logistics Manager

Ensure our goods get from A to B

What do Logistics Managers do?

Logistics Managers are responsible for making sure our goods and resources travel smoothly from the supplier to the customer. They oversee the organisation, storage, distribution and transport of goods in order to keep costs down and operations running efficiently.

If you are a problem-solving expert, have excellent time management skills, and can think quickly on your feet, this could be an ideal career for you.

About you:

- Excellent communicator
- Thorough planner
- Critical thinker
- Time management expert
- Organised and efficient

The job:

- Monitoring the purchasing, storage and supply of goods and materials
- Negotiating contracts with suppliers and other stakeholders

- Developing systems to keep the flow of goods running smoothly
- Liaising with suppliers, staff and customers to ensure smooth processing of items
- Directing and managing other staff, such as warehouse workers
- Monitoring and reviewing storage and inventory systems

This is a large occupation, with around 24,500 people working as Logistics Managers in 2020 (source: joboutlook.gov.au), with strong growth expected over the next five years. Demand for Logistics Managers is highest in New South Wales and Victoria. Most Logistics Managers work in the Transport, Postal and Warehousing, and Manufacturing industries.

Your role as a Logistics Manager might vary depending on the type of goods and materials you are in charge of managing. For example, perishable goods such as food and drink require specialised storage and much stricter deadlines than things like clothing, etc.

How to become a Logistics Manager in Australia

Although formal qualifications aren't a strict requirement, they can greatly boost your skills and employability, and you'll likely need extensive work experience without one.

Step 1 – If you're in Years 9 or 10, try and find work experience in the warehousing or transport industry.

Step 2 – Complete Year 12 with a strong focus on English and Maths.

Step 3 – Consider starting with a VET qualification such as a [Diploma of Logistics](#). This can give you access to entry-level logistics jobs where you can start building your experience.

Step 4 – Build on your management skills with an undergraduate degree, such as a Bachelor of Business majoring in [Logistics and Supply Chain Management](#).

Step 5 – Explore your possibilities working with all kinds of goods, including food and drink, machinery, clothing, raw materials, and more.

What do Logistics Managers do?

Logistics Managers help supply chains run smoothly and keep costs down by overseeing the sourcing, storage, and distribution of a wide variety of goods and materials.

Which industries employ Logistics Managers?

Logistics Managers are usually employed in the Transport, Postal and Warehousing, and Manufacturing industries

What options are there for career progression?

You might start out working for a relatively small company, to managing the supply and distribution of goods around the world.

Do I need to go to university to become a Logistics Manager?

Not necessarily, but without a qualification, you will need lots of practical, hands-on experience to work your way into management positions.

Where do Logistics Managers work?

Logistics Managers are needed all across Australia, particularly in New South Wales and Victoria. They mostly work indoors, in offices and warehouses, as well as having the opportunity for travel.
